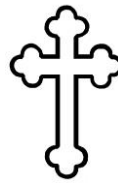
**Parish evening 'get-together' in aid of Medical Missionary Sisters in South Sudan**

### **From Father Brian**

Next week is Sea Sunday, when the Church prays for all who live and work at sea. There will be a retiring collection for Apostleship of the Sea, the official maritime agency of the Catholic Church in Great Britain. It provides practical and spiritual support to seafarers visiting our ports. As it is wholly dependant on voluntary donations, please give generously. Here in Falmouth we have a long tradition in supporting the Apostleship of the Sea and I am confident that this commitment will continue.

### **REFLECTION**

To be a true disciple, working for Jesus and the Kingdom, is no easy matter. It is something which can be achieved effectively only by those who have the inner resources which the Lord alone can give. Those inner resources may be sought through prayer, study and the sacraments. This means that the serious follower of Jesus needs to have a structured spiritual life - a *disciplined* life built on regular prayer and worship. Indeed, if you think about it, the words 'disciple' and 'discipline' share the same root, and one dictionary definition of discipline is, "*A set of rules or methods, as those regulating the practice of a church or monastic order.*"

The God we worship is a God of order, not a God of chaos. We should reflect this by living ordered and disciplined spiritual lives; that is why every practising Christian should have a 'Rule of Life.' This may be fairly simple, such as saying prayers on rising in the morning and on going to bed at night, along with some reading of the Bible at some point in the day; or it may be a little more involved, such as saying the Daily Offices of Morning and Evening Prayer. A 'Rule of Life' should be tailored to the individual's needs and way of life and needs to be seen as being the means of equipping us to follow Jesus and to do his work in the world effectively. (Anyone who wishes to work out a suitable Rule of Life and needs some help are always welcome to speak to a priest for guidance).

What, you may ask, is the reward? Short-term it means true inner peace and the kind of genuine joy the seventy two had when they returned to Jesus, absolutely full of excitement at the experience. Long term, as Jesus told them, it will be having our names written in heaven. The big question is, just how keen are *you* to be a true and active disciple of Jesus...?
