NFP South West is looking to train new teachers in the Billings Ovulation Method (BOM). Applicants should have a basic knowledge of NFP or be willing to learn. We are volunteers available to teach married Catholics and engaged couples to either conceive or postpone conception. The BOM is scientifically proven and fully compatible with Church teaching on marriage and family life. Training is via 10 correspondence computer modules, over 10 consecutive months after which there are 2 training days per year at Buckfast and one in London.
