From Father Brian

We have received the following advice from the Bishop Mark concerning Coronavirus.

1. All ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands before Mass and use an alcohol-based, anti-bacterial solution before and after distributing Holy Communion.
2. Refrain from physical contact during the Sign of Peace (note the Sign of Peace can be exchanged without physical contact.).
3. Holy Communion via the Chalice will not be available during this time.
4. To avoid contact with saliva in the distribution of Holy Communion every person is asked to receive Holy Communion reverently on the hand for the time being. The clergy would really appreciate if everyone would receive communion on the hand.
5. Refrain from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer.
6. All hymn books have been collected in, we will provide disposable sheets.
7. Plates will no longer be passed round during the offertory, would you please place your collection in the baskets available at the back of the church when you arrive or leave.

Faithful who are sick or experiencing symptoms of sickness are not obliged to attend Mass and out of charity and consideration they ought not to attend. This is in line with the Catechism of the Catholic Church which allows for absence of attendance for serious reasons like sickness. You will have noticed that the Holy Water stoups have been emptied.

Please use the hand sanitizing gel available in the porches of our churches.
