
### Helston and Mullion

DURING THIS TIME OF CRISIS...

1. The most important priority is to keep yourself, your loved ones and the community SAFE and HEALTHY.
2. Please be aware that, although Fr. Paul is under 70, he does have an underlying health condition which puts him into the "most vulnerable" category, so should be socially distancing or physically isolating himself (various terms are being used). Bearing this in mind, for their mutual safety, he will not be making any visits to residential homes or hospitals except in case of an extreme emergency. All are invited to keep in touch by telephone or other social media.
3. There will usually be a private mass in Helston at 9.30 on Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays; and in Mullion at 10.00 on Fridays. Mass intentions will still be accepted for these masses.  
*Please note, though they will be celebrated before the church doors open.*
4. **ST MARY'S CATHOLIC CHURCH, HELSTON, will be open EVERY DAY for private prayer from 10.00 – 18.00; & Sundays 09.00 – 18.00.**
5. **THE CHURCH OF ST MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL, MULLION, will be open on for private prayer on WEDNESDAYS from 10.00-11.00; FRIDAYS from 10.30 – 12.00 & SUNDAYS from 11.00 – 12.00.**
6. Please use the hand sanitizer on entry/exit.
7. Please avoid touching any objects (books, leaflets, door handles, etc.) with your bare hands if at all possible.
8. If there are other people at prayer in the church, please keep a distance of AT LEAST 10 feet (2 metres) from any other person.


9. Disposable prayer resources will be available in the church. Unless you wish to take them home, please leave in the recycling box by the door on your exit.
10. **The Sacrament of Confession** will be available upon request at both churches. Please speak to the priest in church or ring the Presbytery for an appointment.
11. There is a great deal of useful and interesting material online.
