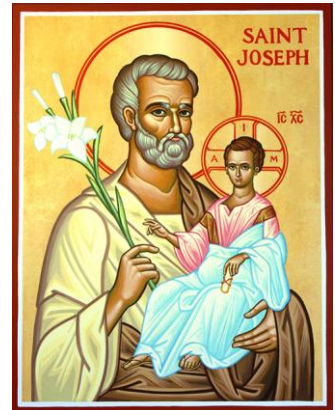

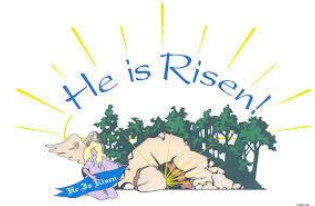
**From Father Brian**
