It is really good to see so many people returning to Sunday worship. Some extra chairs have been added, but please make sure a social distance is still maintained.

The new Sunday mass leaflet for Ordinary Time contains revised instructions about receiving the Blessed Sacrament. PLEASE READ THEM CAREFULLY. Also, as we are now able to have an Offertory Procession, but not a collection in the seats, please put your offering in the basket on the way **IN** to church from now on. There may occasionally be a retiring collection too on the way out!!! We are very grateful to those who now give by Direct Debit instead.

The Live Mass from Helston can now be watched on the parish website www.falmouthcatholicchurch.org.uk Just click on the Live Mass tab then scroll down to choose your church: Falmouth or Helston!! Please note, if viewing on-line, that Monday's (private) mass is at 11.00 because of the Bank Holiday.

And although "Ordinary Time" returned last Monday, the first "green" Sunday will not be until 13th June. By then I would like to have all our **various church rotas** re-established. This is the opportunity for those who are not yet on any of these to volunteer. There are lists on the table at the back of St Mary's & in the porch at St Michael's. We shall need readers, eucharistic ministers both in church and to visit the sick, collection counters, welcomers, sacristans, members of the Shawl Ministry, cleaners and, eventually, musicians, helpers with the children's liturgy, and persons to look after the collection & presentation of the gifts. Will those who draw up these rotas please look at the names of the new volunteers as well as your established helpers, and have new rotas prepared by 5th June. I would hope that everybody would be able to put their name on at least one of these lists!

Both our Church communities seem to have come through the crisis of this past year relatively unscathed. In thanksgiving, we are replacing the rather sad and weather-beaten statue of Our Lady in the Lourdes Grotto at Helston. If you would like to make a contribution there will be a basket at the back of church on Sunday mornings. At Mullion "one of our own" is going to repaint the lovely bas-relief of the Sacred Heart on the outside of the porch, which greets everyone as they come from the car park.

First Holy Communion 2021

After consulting and seeking advice from the catechists the following programme is planned. These children will make their First Reconciliation before the summer break and celebrate First Holy Communion in September. The current Year 3 and the new Year 3 (from September) will begin their preparation in January 2022 and celebrate their First Holy Communion in May 2022. Therefore, the First Holy Communion preparations for 2022 will comprise two year groups. Thank you for your patience and understanding.
