It is really good to see so many people returning to Sunday worship. Some extra chairs have been added, but please make sure a social distance is still maintained.

A new Sunday leaflet for mass in Ordinary Time under the new stage 3 restrictions contains revised instructions about receiving the Blessed Sacrament. PLEASE READ THEM CAREFULLY. Also, as we are now able to have an Offertory Procession, but not a collection in the seats, please put your offering in the basket on the way **IN** to church from now on. There may occasionally be a retiring collection too on the way out!!! We are very grateful to those who now give by Direct Debit instead. Although all other sheets can go in the recycling box, to save paper please put these mass leaflets in the wire tray as they can be re-used after 48 hours in quarantine.

The hall cleaner is off furlough and spending the next few weeks cleaning our hall ready for its re-opening, which we hope will be at the end of the month, depending on government instructions.
