A VERY WARM WELCOME to those visiting us for Mass today, and to all those returning after a while away. It is really good to see so many people returning to Sunday worship. Regulars will notice that we have removed all the tape and signs from the benches, and some extra chairs have been added, but this does NOT mean that the pandemic is over. With an increasing number of visitors

arriving in family bubbles the signage made seating a bit difficult. Family bubbles may always sit together, but **everyone else must keep to the approved social distance** separation of at least 1 metre, **face coverings must continue to be worn** and **the one-way system must be followed**. In view of the recent rise in cases in Cornwall, the windows and doors will now all remain open through the summer months for increased ventilation.

Today is Bruce Kirkland's final mass among us as he is leaving to move nearer to his sons in Newark, Notts. We were pleased to inter Celia's ashes and to bless a tree in her memory last Thursday. We wish Bruce every blessing in his new home.

Morning Prayer is recited publicly on Tuesdays and Thursdays 20 minutes before mass. All are welcome to join in. No books are necessary.

At public masses we are now reciting the "Prayer for Spiritual Communion" not only for the benefit of those who are watching on line, but also to remind those actually able to be at worship in church that we are all a part of a much larger worshipping community.

We are still waiting to hear when our hall may re-open, we hope it will be sometime later this month, but we have to obey both the latest government instructions and Diocesan & national Church guidance, which is not always the same as for other halls.
