We are very pleased to welcome John Pinhay to both our Sunday masses. John will speak to us about the work of Stella Maris.

A VERY WARM WELCOME to those visiting us for Mass today, and to all those returning after a while away. It is really good to see so many people returning to Sunday worship. We are waiting to hear how last Monday's announcements will be implemented in our churches; meanwhile all the old rules still apply. Family bubbles may always sit together, but **everyone else must keep to the approved social distance** separation of at least 1 metre, **face coverings must continue to be worn** and **the one-way system must still be followed**. The windows and doors must all remain open to increase ventilation. **Please read the instructions in the mass leaflet regarding Holy Communion.**

Heather Ashton's Funeral mass is on Friday at 1.30. Fr Jon Bielawski is coming down from Plymouth to officiate. As we anticipate being out of government restrictions by then, there is no need to worry about attendance numbers. After the committal at Camborne crematorium there will be a reception at Wheal Dream at 4.30 for all Heather's friends and acquaintances, **please let Marie Ashton on 075 4358 7737 know if you would like to attend.**

Morning Prayer is recited publicly on Tuesdays and Thursdays 20 minutes before mass. All are welcome to join in. No books are necessary.

At public masses we are now reciting the "Prayer for Spiritual Communion" not only for the benefit of those who are watching on-line and for members of our own congregation unable to receive at this time; but also to remind us who are able to be at worship in church that we are all a part of a much larger worshipping community.

We are planning to re-open the church hall on the 1st August, but are still waiting to see if there are any special government instructions or Diocesan & national Church guidance, which will come into force. Assuming we *can* go ahead, **there will be coffee after mass on Sunday, 1st August.** Would whoever is responsible for that rota please do one!

Speaking of rotas, I was asked why the welcomers rota is not published yet. Quite simply until we knew what restrictions were going to be in place I didn't know how many people would need to be

on duty on a Sunday morning. I will have it published and ready to come into force on 1st August.

Covid Update – The Kanji Project

Ian Parr managed to get through to speak to Maria, to see what the situation was around Kanji, Tamil Nadu. Maria stated that the Covid situation was still serious. They are all in lock down. The school has been closed for over a year. The teachers provide online lessons to the oldest students, but this only reaches about 50% due to lack of technology and wi-fi. Many friends, family, and workers from the local villages, that Maria knows, have died over the last year. She has also lost several nuns who she knew very well. The death toll in India so far is stated to be over 400,000. This number is known to be lower than reality. The Indian Government has so far administered covid vaccinations to around 280 million adults, mainly in the largest cities. Maria has not yet been vaccinated as it appears that the poor rural villages are last to receive the vaccinations. She hopes to get her first vaccination in 2 to 3 weeks. The Government aims to vaccinate all 980 million adults by the end of the year. The pace is slow, there is a shortage of vaccine, and a lot of vaccine hesitancy.
