## Helston & Mullion News

**A VERY WARM WELCOME** to those visiting us for Mass at either of our churches today, and to all those returning after a while away. **The church hall at Helston is open again** so there will be coffee after mass; we hope our visitors will stay and enjoy a little hospitality.

It is really good to see so many people returning to Sunday worship. Under the new Stage 4 Restrictions, in our churches **the hand sanitiser must be used by all at entry and exit; face coverings must continue to be worn** at least on entry and exit and when singing and, in the designated area, AT ALL TIMES. Those who wish to keep a **social distance** should pick up one or two “space please” signs as they come in. The windows and doors will all remain open to increase ventilation. **Please read the full information on the little red sheet.** The Monday mass will continue to be said privately, so that we shall not need to clean the church except after special services, closer than 48 hours together. The hymn books and our usual mass cards can now be used once again.

**THE SHAWL MINISTRY has resumed on Thursdays from 10 am until 12 Noon** in the Church Hall, Helston. All are welcome with or without needles or crochet hooks. Our Ministry is to provide comfort, conversation and community in addition to knitted or crochet products and prayer for anyone who requests them at absolutely no cost. We accept donations of yarn, patterns, needles, etc and will make shawls or blankets for the sick, bereaved, lonely, homeless or new born. We also make scarves and hats for Seafarers and are currently making a Funeral Pall for St Mary's, Helston. **Statement from Churches Together:** At a recent meeting we decided to disband the formal 'Churches Together in Mullion, Cury and Gunwalloe' group. The old constitution and style of doing things were no longer helpful to our ecumenical ways of working together. Instead we are going to re-launch a more informal network or group of 'Christians Together on the Lizard Peninsula' which offers us more flexibility and freedom. So be assured that ecumenical work will continue in our community and people can volunteer or opt in to help with specific projects rather than have to commit to being a Rep on a committee. The meetings will be open meetings to

anyone who is interested in finding out more about ways of working together and sharing in joint projects. **The first meeting of 'Christians Together on the Lizard Peninsula' (CTLP) will be on Monday 1st Nov. at 4pm at the Catholic Church in Mullion.**

**Morning Prayer** is recited publicly on Tuesdays and Thursdays at Helston 20 minutes before mass. All are welcome.

At public masses we are reciting the “**Prayer for Spiritual Communion**” by St Alphonsus Ligouri not only for the benefit of those who are watching on-line and for members of our own congregation present but unable to receive Holy Communion at this time for any reason; but also to remind those of us who *are* able to be at worship in church that we are all a part of a much larger worshipping community.
