Under the Stage 4 Restrictions, Those who wish to keep a **social distance** should pick up one or two "**space please**" signs as they come in; **the hand sanitiser must be used by all at entry and exit** and **face coverings must continue to be worn** at least on entry and exit and when singing and, in the designated area, AT ALL TIMES.
