A VERY WARM WELCOME to those visiting us for Mass at either of our churches today, and to all those returning after a while away. The church hall at Helston is open again so there will be **coffee after mass**; we hope our visitors will stay and enjoy a little hospitality.

THIS THURSDAY – The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary: after the noon mass we shall bless the new Lourdes statue at the shrine. Hopefully there will be refreshments afterwards. Please invite any ecumenical friends with a love of Our Lady – and pray for fine weather!

It's lovely to see so many people returning to Sunday worship. Under the current Stage 4 Restrictions, those who wish to keep a **social distance** should pick up one or two "**space please**" signs from the table as they come in and place them on the seat beside them; **the hand sanitiser must be used by all at entry and exit and face coverings must continue to be worn** at least on entry and exit and when singing and, in the designated area, AT ALL TIMES. Please read the full information on the red sheet.

A reminder that **on Mondays Fr Paul is the "on call" Catholic Chaplain for Treliske hospital** so if you can't reach him at the Presbytery please try the mobile number (as on the front of this bulletin).

A number of people have expressed an interest in becoming Catholics and joining the Church, in fact six people are undergoing preparation at the moment. If you are interested in joining them please let Fr Paul know a.s.a.p. Similarly, if you believe there is a barrier to you receiving Holy Communion at this time please talk to Fr Paul, as it may be possible to do something about it.

There is no mass at Helston on Tues. 19th Oct, as Fr Paul has to attend a meeting at St Rita's, Honiton.
