Please note no 6.00 pm Mass. **Sunday** 26<sup>th</sup> December 9.00 am Mass Mawnan Smith, Falmouth 10.30 am. I am aware that some will be disappointed that there will be no traditional Midnight Mass but with the continuing restrictions and uncertainties due to COVID I sincerely believe this is the best solution. I appreciate your understanding.

You will be aware that the wearing of face coverings in Places of Worship is now legally mandatory.
