A VERY WARM WELCOME

to all who are worshipping with us today.
*There is coffee or tea after mass on Sundays
in the church hall at Helston;*

A reminder that the **Solemnity of St Peter and St Paul**, which we celebrate this week, is a Holy Day of Obligation. Now that the obligation has been restored in E&W, unless there is a valid reason, everyone should be at one of these masses.

We are gradually moving back more and more to the ways things were pre-pandemic.

We are now using the Catholic Publishing Company's "Jerusalem" mass sheets for Sundays. These are slightly different from the "Emmaus" sheets we used pre-pandemic in that they contain more of the mass, and mass cards are not needed. If there is a general feeling that the Emmaus sheets were better suited for us we can change back at any time, but we need to let CPS know by 10th July for the next distribution.

From this Monday THERE WILL BE NO MORE DAILY MASS SHEETS. As in pre-pandemic, days, the daily antiphons will be provided for congregational use, but if you wish to follow the readings, etc. you will need to bring a daily missal.

HELP NEEDED: Fr Paul is in Oberammergau on Sunday 15th August. Fr David Annear is covering the services, but he has given up driving. He will catch the bus to Helston, but we need someone to drive him to Mullion and bring him back; *if not there will be no mass at Mullion that Sunday!!!*
