Our regular **Holy Hour at Mullion** on Monday will include the usual Benediction, coffee and chat.

We are gradually moving back more and more to the ways things were pre-pandemic so there are no more daily mass sheets. As in pre-pandemic days, the daily antiphons will be provided for congregational use, but if you wish to follow the readings, etc. you will need to bring a daily missal. If you have an "old" (pre-2010) daily missal then for the most part the readings won't have changed, it's only the mass that's different. Some people are using "Magnificat"; or you could use an e-reader (on tablet or mobile phone). There are even a few of these available to borrow on request. A sheet with the **Anthem to Our Lady** (said at the end of mass) on it is also available for those who need it.
