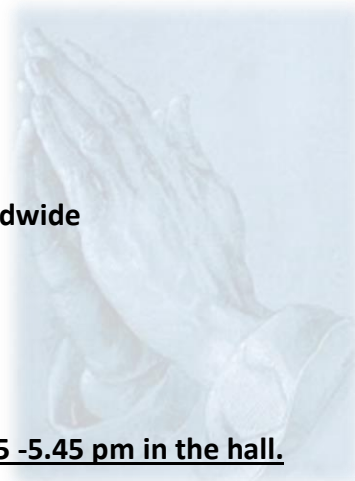

## Helston & Mullion News

### A VERY WARM WELCOME

to all who are worshipping with us today.

*There is coffee or tea after mass on Sundays  
in the church hall at Helston;*

PLEASE NOTE the new "Jerusalem" Sunday mass sheets contain ALL that is required to fully take part in the mass. The priest will endeavour to use the options chosen on that sheet any particular week for Rite of Penance, Preface & Eucharistic Prayer, Memorial Acclamation, etc. If a mass setting is used it will either be in the hymn book or a copy will be provided for those who may wish to have the music

We are gradually moving back more and more to the ways things were pre-pandemic so there are no more daily mass sheets. As in pre-pandemic days, the daily antiphons will be provided for congregational use, but if you wish to follow the readings, etc. you will need to bring a daily missal. If you have an "old" (pre-2010) daily missal then for the most part the readings won't have changed, it's only the mass that's different. Some people are using "Magnificat"; or you could use an e-reader (on tablet or mobile phone).

A sheet with the **Anthem to Our Lady** (said at the end of every mass) on it is also available for those who need it.

**Monday 1<sup>st</sup> August:** "First Monday" Holy Hour with Benediction, Coffee and chat at Mullion, beginning at 18.00. Please feel free to come and go at any time during the devotion, there is no obligation to stay for an hour! ALL WELCOME.

**Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> August:** an extra celebration of mass at Helston for **the Feast of the Transfiguration**.

If you would like the YouTube uploads from both churches and the Facebook live-streaming from Mullion to continue after Sept 1 someone will need to offer to do it in each church. (The live-stream from Helston will continue to be available on the parish website.)
