A VERY WARM WELCOME

to all who are worshipping with us today.

in the church hall at Helston;*

The **social committee** are meeting after mass today.

PLEASE NOTE in Helston today (being the 5th Sunday in the month) we are celebrating one of our children's masses. Everything you need to follow the mass is on the mass sheet or in the hymnbook. After today, the children's liturgy group are on holiday until September.

In Mullion: everything is on the Jerusalem Mass Sheet, as usual.

BOTH CHURCHES Please put the mass sheets in the recycling box after use. Thank you.

We are gradually moving back more and more to the ways things were pre-pandemic so there are no more daily mass sheets. As in pre-pandemic days, the daily antiphons are provided for congregational use, but if you wish to follow the readings, etc. you will need to bring a daily missal. If you have an "old" (pre-2010) daily missal then, for the most part, the readings won't have changed, it's only the mass that's different. Some people are using "Magnificat"; or you could use an e-reader (on tablet or mobile phone).

A sheet with the **Anthem to Our Lady** (said at the end of every mass) on it is also available for those who need it.

Tuesday 2nd August: The "First Monday" Holy Hour with Benediction, Coffee and chat at Mullion, will be on TUESDAY this month beginning at 18.00. (because of Wednesday's funeral Fr Paul will have to take Monday as his day off). Please feel free to come and go at any time during the devotion, there is no obligation to stay for an hour! ALL WELCOME.

Saturday 6th August: an extra celebration of mass at Helston for **the Feast of the Transfiguration**.

Mission Appeal Weekend

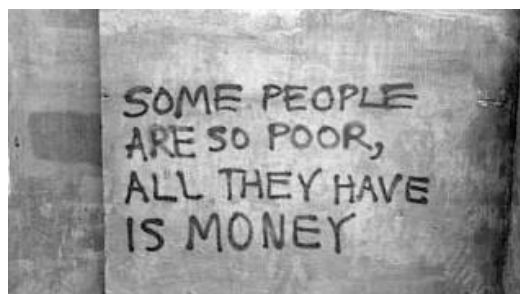
