We are gradually moving back more and more to the ways things were pre-pandemic so there are no more daily mass sheets. As in pre-pandemic days, the daily antiphons are provided for congregational use, but if you wish to follow the readings, etc. you will need to bring a daily missal. If you have an "old" (pre-2010) daily missal then, for the most part, the readings won't have changed, it's only the mass that's different. Some people are using "Magnificat"; or you could use an e-reader (on tablet or mobile phone).

A sheet with the **Anthem to Our Lady** (said at the end of every mass) on it is also available for those who need it.

From today the only YouTube upload will be from Mullion, as there has been no volunteer to record and process the mass in Helston. For your information, viewing figures for the Helston recording were usually between 17 and 20 on a Sunday, though more at Mullion, and up to 50 on an occasional weekday. Both Helston and Mullion will still be available as live-streamed services: Helston on our parish website and Mullion on a new Facebook page, to be advised in due course. Regretfully, no numbers are available for those who watch the live-stream.

Dipping into the catechism. The current weekly sheet is available from the display rack on the table, but all previous weeks are also available from the black folder in the porch. Please help yourself, but let Fr Paul know if any run out.

After 31st August the presbytery office in Helston will be closed and the telephone will not take any messages. All callers will be asked to re-direct their enquiries to the parish office in Falmouth (numbers on the front page of this bulletin).

Season of Creation 2022

The burning bush is the symbol for this year's Season of Creation which runs from 1 September until the Feast of St Francis of Assisi on 4 October. The recent prevalence of wildfires and the hot and dry summer are signs of the devastating effects that climate change is having on the most vulnerable of our planet. Creation cries out as forests burn and people and animals are forced to migrate. However, the fire that called to Moses as he tended the flock on Mount Horeb did not consume or destroy the bush. This flame of the Spirit revealed God's presence. In this Season of Creation, this symbol of God's Spirit calls us to listen to the voice of creation and consider how we can be good stewards of the earth's valuable resources.
