Flores de Mayo & Santacruzan 2023

Flores de Mayo (Flowers of May) is a festival in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated in the Philippines during the month of May. This is a very popular and traditional festival that is now celebrated in many parts of the world where Filipinos are living.

Santacruzan (Festival of the Holy Cross) a legend – a festivity depicting the searching and finding of the true Holy Cross by Queen Helena, mother of Constantine the Great, who was a new convert to Christianity.
