Many legends are associated with Saint Piran including his discovery of the precious metal tin, and he is the patron saint of tin-miners. However, many scholars believe that St. Piran was a Bishop who travelled to Cornwall from Ireland in the late 5th or early 6th century. It is believed that St Piran settled in North Cornwall giving his name to Perranporth, where he built an oratory. The Feast of St Piran reminds us that Cornwall has a long and proud Christian heritage and we ask St Piran to pray for all the people who make Cornwall their home and for Cornish people throughout the world.
